Also introduced was our National guest Sous Chef de Chemin de Fer Kevin Johnson of Missouri and National Nurses Training Treasurer Ralph Turner also from Missouri.

Grand Correspondant Orval read the resolving clause from each nomination.

FINANCE COMMITTEE MEETING: Grand Chef de Gare Dave Behling called the Finance Committee to order at 1:26 P. M. Following the Pledge of Allegiance the meeting Roll Call was taken by the Grand Correspondant. The Grand Chef, Grand Correspondant, Grand Commissaire Intendant were present. Sous Commissaire Intendant George Heck and Ray Pasbrig were also in attendance. Committee Members George Heck and John Helgeson were present. Ken Kozubek was excused due to his upcoming heart surgery.

The meeting was turned over to Grand Commissaire Intendant Jim Vissers for his report. Review of the 2023-2024 Budget. Budget is at \$12,203.93. Our Investment Portfolio is valued at \$949,382.75 as of the end of June. This is an increase of \$93,678.47 from the previous year. \$30,000.00 of this was put in to our investments from the Robert Polaske Estate. Net Worth of the Grande Voiture stands at \$966,334.86. Great Lakes profit was \$1,815.17.

V. Vissers then went over the proposed budget for the 2024-2025 year. John Edelblute wanted to know about sponsoring a Badger Girl. Ask the Cabane. There were a few more questions on the budget.

\$90,000.00 is in Restricted Funds.

Finance meeting was closed at 1:52 PM with a Salute to the Colors.

TIME AND PLACE COMMITTEE MEETING: Grand Chef Dave Behling called the Time & Place meeting to order at 1:58 P. M. following a Salute to the Colors and Pledge of Allegiance and Roll Call. An update on the 2024 Grande Promenade this weekend.

Bids were asked for hosting the 2025 Grande Midwinter Petite and Grande Promenade & Rendezvous or other future events. None have been received. But there is a lot of talk on possible sites.

Talk of La Crosse Voiture hosting next year's Grande but it will be in La Cresent, MN. Also talk on Langlade Voiture # 1204 hosting either Midwinter or the Grande in Antigo. Need written bids before any action can be taken.

BADGER FORTY ET EIGHTER: L'editeur Tom Orval spoke on the upcoming fiscal year of the Badger Forty et Eighter. Need articles and pictures within 3 weeks. Labor Day weekend is the deadline. All questions were answered. The Correspondant will send out a schedule as to when articles are due. Meeting lasted about 12 minutes.

FRIDAY AUGUST 2nd

Grand Chef de Gare Dave Behling called the 103rd Annual Grande Promenade to order at 9:00 A.M. Colors already being posted the Voyageurs saluted the Colors and recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Invocation the Grand Aumonier Ray Kline with the Alter Cloth and the placing of the POW-MIA Seat Cover by Grand Chef de Train Ken Laatsch, the Promenade was opened for such business as to come before it.

National Ritual Directeur Steve Bradley wanted to know if all of the Line Officers have a Ritual Manuel! Wanted to know why he doesn't use the Ritual book instead of the scripted program that came word for word out of the Ritual book.

Correspondant Orval stated that it is scripted right out of the Ritual Manual and he is the one who did this. Questions on purchasing Ritual Manuels for all Line Officers. Get the larger ones.

Approval of the Official Call as was sent out electronically. A notion was offered, seconded and carried.

Roll Call was taken by the Grand Correspondant.

Distinguished Guests Sous Chairman John Edelblute introduced National Guest Sous Chef de Chemin de Fer Keving Johnson of the Grande du Missouri along with Voyageur Ralph Turner who is traveling with him this weekend. Ralph is National Nurses Training Treasurer.

V. Edelblute then offered a notion to fine the Grand Chef \$1.00 for not letting him introduce the guests. It was in the program. Fined him \$1.00 anyway. Seconded and Carried!

V. Mitchell offered a notion to fine V. Edelblute \$1.00 for jumping the gun and getting everyone all excited. Seconded and Carried!

Approval of the 2023 Grande Promenade minutes and the 2024 Midwinter Petite minutes that were also sent out electronically. All were Carried!

Grand Chef de Gare Dave Behling then welcomed everyone to the Grand Promenade this weekend. We'll have Roll Call now. We already had Roll Call. Someone is a little nervous!

Greetings by V. Eric Diekmann who is the General Chairman of this event. Monroe County # 804 Chef de Gare Lori Zimmerman also gave greetings.

RULES AND ORDER: Chairman George Heck gave the Committee's report with the Delegates being in line with the number of Voyageurs that each Locale has. Rules will be followed in the Grande Voiture Constitution and Bylaws and Standing Rules of Order. A copy of the Roberts Rules and Order in in the folder. Would like to see a change when addressing the Membership that when you address the body, you will state which Locale you belong to! Notion was offered for acceptance of report. Seconded and carried!

ACTIVITIES: Directeur Ken Kozubek was excused due to his upcoming surgery. His report was read by the Grand Correspondant. 13 Locales reported. 12410 participated in the various events. There were 1569 events. Guests totaled 676. Hours accumulated were 18810. Money spent totaled \$59,526. Mileage was 41,563 and there were 5 Rolling Stock. Notion was offered for acceptance. Seconded and carried!

AMERICANISM: Ken Laatsch stated when he first got the reports from the Grand Correspondant, there were 25. Fantastic and then he counted them. 7 were from the same Locale. "CRAP". Total hours were 7,856, Actual miles came to 6,549 and actual cash was \$13,054. Total hours were \$194,880, Miles came to \$35,916.50 and total cash spent was \$46,469. Per Capita this came to \$367.24 per Voyageur. Total cash and services were \$227,265.50.

Then V. Laatsch phone went off and being that it is new he didn't know how to shut it off. Automatic \$1.00 fine. Notion for acceptance of the Americanism report; Seconded ad Carried!

BADGER FORTY ET EIGHTER: L'editeur Tom Orval stated that last year we won the John Kilgus award for the most outstanding publication in all of La Societe. This is his 9th time winning the award. He was also awarded the National L'editeur of the Year Award. He then spoke about effectively sending in articles and pictures for either the fall, winter, spring or summer publications. Notion and second for acceptance. A few questions were asked and answered. Notion was carried.

NATIONAL BOX CAR ASSOCIATION: Directeur John Aasen has a lot of pins from years ago if anyone wants any. He used to get 350 pins each year along with many Crew and Associate cards, but that figure has dropped off considerably. Now it's 100 pins, 100 Associate cards and 150 Crew cards. Please support the Box Car program because it gives all of its money back to the other programs every year. Voyageur John then thanked Sous Directeur John Vissers for all of his work over the last year. He also sells many of Johns other raffle tickets. A notion was then offered for acceptance of the report. Seconded and carried!

CARVILLE STAR: Not in attendance and no report was sent. Should be here tomorrow.

CHILD WELFARE: Grand Directeur Eric Diekmann reported that there have been multiple fires in which the 40 et 8 have helped with the children. This last year the Grande Voiture has assisted 21 children and spent \$6,623 from the Charles W. Ardery Fund

Remember that \$500 can be spent on each child and a maximum of \$2,000 per family.

V. Eric then spoke on the proper way to fill out the annual Child Welfare Communique report. Notion was offered, seconded and carried for acceptance of report.

CHARLES ARDERY REPORT: Grand Correspondant Orval reported that La Societe spent \$8,719.36 assisting children this last year. Wisconsin had 8 claims and all were paid in full. However, one claim from La Crosse he could only allow \$500 to be reimbursed because they were approximately \$147 over the limit. South Dakota had 3 claims and Michigan had 1. He then gave a number of financial figures out to the membership on the Ardery Fund. Total funds in the Ardery Fund are \$2,734,389.06. Notion for acceptance. Seconded and carried!

NURSES TRAINING: Directeur Dale Mitchell has three Nursing students from Peshtigo, Appleton and Fond du Lac. There are two openings. \$1,000 per scholarship. He then broke down the criteria of sending in scholarship applications to National. You have to get the applications from National. Can't get it on the website. Twenty reports were turned in. Over \$11,000 was spent on scholarships in Wisconsin this year.

JACK D. WILSON FUND: Grand Commissaire Intendant Jim Vissers reported that there was \$20,000.95 last year. Two scholarship checks were written totaling \$1,000. Income was \$44,011.97 from the Robert Polaske estate. Total in the account is now \$63,012.92.

GEORGE B. BOLAND FUND: Tom Orval reported that this last year there were 25 inquiries, 16 applications and 15 scholarships awarded. They each were for \$1,500. 10 Grande Voitures had scholarships approved came from Louisiana, South Dakota, North Carolina, Missouri, South Carolina, Montana, Indiana, Georgia and Idaho. Net income was \$123,986.66; Unrestricted Net Assets were at \$176,368.17. Total funds in the George B. Boland Fund are at \$1,311,689.41. Notion was offered for acceptance of report. Seconded and carried!

POW-MIA: Jim Bassett was excused due to his wife Sharon still rehabbing from her illness. Read by V. Jim Vissers. The POW-MIA Scholarship Program relies on the sales of merchandise such as pin sales along with the bolo ties. This last year Wisconsin raised \$428.00 worth of POW-MIA pins. The Grand Correspondant is assisting with the 2025 pin sales.

11 Locales submitted POW/MIA reports. Of those 11 Locales, 7 showed no activity. Of the Locales reporting, there were 5,502-man hours, 15,535 miles, expenses of \$5,509.00 for an equivalent of \$340,787 in support of the POW/MIA Scholarship Program. A notion was offered for acceptance. Seconded and carried!

PUBLIC RELATIONS: Directeur Tom Orval spoke on all Locales trying to promote and maintain a positive image of La Societe to the general public. Press releases and pictures should be sent to the local newspapers. 16 Locales submitted Communique reports. What better way to promote La Societe then to get pictures or articles on all the wonderful things your Locale does. Should generate interest on membership in the Veterans lining in the area. Some would send in articles and pictures on a regular basis. Notion was offered for acceptance. Seconded and carried!

RITUAL: Grande and National Directeur Steve Bradley reminded everyone to open and close Promenades accordingly to Ritual. The Blue Ritual and Manual of Ceremonies should be used in all Memorial Services. A black banner should be draped over the flag to show respect when there

is a death of a fellow Voyageur. V. Bradley also spoke on the Alter Cloth and when it is to be removed during Initiations and Installations of Officers. Notion for acceptance of the Ritual Report. Seconded and carried!

SPECIAL AWARDS: Ron Pfalzgraf stated he sent in no Special Awards nominations to National this year. There were 15 Locales reporting and 13 had no reports on them. Even if you do not have a nomination, you can still report man hours and miles. If you go to the National Promenade and attend Generals Club luncheon, you can report money hours and miles.

City or Town of the Year and be resubmitted if they didn't win every three years. Notion was offered and seconded to accept the report as given. Carried.

VAVS: Directeur Edelblute unfortunately left the reports at home so he will adlib. V. John spoke on the Keep Those Wheel Chairs Rolling. 17 submissions were sent in. Milwaukee will receive \$950; Madison shall receive \$700 for the Food Pantry. Tomah will get \$500 for golf equipment. 10 Communique reports were sent in with seven reporting activity.

Would like to see more Voyageurs volunteering at the VA. Notion for acceptance. Seconded and carried.

Voyageur Mitchell spoke on supporting the NBCA which donates funds to the VA.

ZABLOCKI VA: Representative VA Rep John Edelblute IV stated he volunteers between 24 and 32 hours a week. A Baby Shower event is coming up on October 23rd. August 15th is a volunteer banquet. Notion for acceptance. Seconded and carried.

Middleton Madison VA: VA Rep Gerry Scalissi was excused. His report was read by the Grand Correspondant. V. Gerry talked about the new Madison East VA Clinic. An Open House is scheduled for some time in September. They did begin to receive new patients on July 10th. V. Gerry is in therapy presently due to numbness in his elbows, hands and legs. Notion for acceptance of report. Seconded and carried.

TOMAH VA: George Bloom reported 181 hours, 4,964 hours and assisted 82 Veterans at the Tomah VA. Becky Fitzpatrick had 240 volunteer hours. V. George also spoke about where he has been these last 6 months. He was also in St. Germain for 40 et 8 Days at Camp. He and Marion are coming back next year. Notion for acceptance. Seconded and carried!

After a 10-minute break the Grand Chef de Gare called the 2024 Grande Promenade back to order without his gavel. Some Voyageur stole it from under his nose. Who could have done such a dastardly deed. Grand Commis Voyageur Minch offered a notion to fine the Grand Chef \$10.00 for losing the gavel and then he returned the gavel to its proper place in the hand of Grand Chef Dave.
